ALUMNI IN ADMISSIONS: CONNECTING WITH POTENTIAL FRANKLIN PIERCE STUDENTS

Choosing the right college/university goes well beyond the academic program. It includes making a personal connection with the school through the personal experiences of current students and alumni. As an alum you are uniquely qualified to promote your alma mater. It is your experiences at Pierce that will make Franklin Pierce come alive to prospective students. If you interested in making a difference in the lives of future FPU students, we invite you to become a vital part of Franklin Pierce University's recruitment efforts!

The offices of Alumni Relations and Admissions have joined together in creating a new program called "Alumni in Admissions". This program will provide both alumni and prospective students the opportunity to build and strengthen relationships with Franklin Pierce University. Admissions and Alumni Relations are establishing the following initiatives to be implemented beginning in the fall of 2009:

Alumni Profiles: Alumni are encouraged to write about their personal stories reflecting on their time at Pierce. What did you discover as a student at Franklin Pierce? How did Franklin Pierce change your life and prepare you for your future? Short or long, whatever your inclination, your story has value to students considering a Franklin Pierce education.

Alumni Videos: In a two-minute video filmed on campus, alumni will talk about their individual college experience or get together with Pierce friends and share group experiences. Hearing an authentic story and seeing real people tell it can be a powerful way for prospective students to connect with Franklin Pierce.

Volunteer at College Fairs: The objective of a college fair is to give high school students, parents, and guidance counselors the opportunity to talk with college/university representatives and to learn more about institutions of interest. In many cases, the college fair is the first contact a prospective student has with a college/university. We are selecting a few alumni in specific geographic regions, with specific skills and capabilities to represent Franklin Pierce at college fairs. These fairs are held at a variety of times and locations

during the fall and spring months. Alumni chosen to represent the University at these fairs will be required to understand current opportunities and programming at Franklin Pierce, participate in an admissions training workshop and be articulate and enthusiastic about their experiences at Franklin Pierce!

Letters from Alumni: Prospective students and parents are frequently asking us to quantify the return on the investment in a Franklin Pierce University education. Letters from alumni describing how their time at Franklin Pierce made a positive contribution to their career aspirations and attainment speaks positively to the benefits of a Franklin Pierce education. We encourage you to share career successes with our prospective students.

These are just a couple of great memories and stories that alumni have to share. The Admissions Office wants to share your story with prospective Franklin Pierce students. From life changing reflections to a moment in time etched in your mind, every experience is significant when telling the Franklin Pierce story. Through the collective experiences of alumni the Franklin Pierce experience emerges and becomes authentic.

Alumni Network Contact: Alumni will be contacting prospective students from their area who have been accepted for the following Fall semester. You will call and personally congratulate these students and

Saturday, May 16th 2009 marked the forty-fourth commencement ceremony for Franklin Pierce since the first class of students enrolled in 1962, and the second commencement ceremony since the school was recognized as a university in July of 2007. The ceremony also marks Dr. George J. Hagerty's first commencement as President Emeritus, having retired this summer after fourteen years of service to the university. The ceremony took place on the Rindge campus at 10:30 a.m., and to the delight of all those in attendance managed to miss the rain showers predicted for later in the day.

The ceremony opened with the processional, led by Dr. James F. Maybury Jr., with traditional Scottish pipes and Pomp and Circumstance, provided by the New England Brass Quintet. When all were seated the invocation was led by Interfaith Campus Minister Rev. Bill Beardslee. Pamela Halfacre '09 led the audience in an inspirational rendition of the Franklin Pierce Alma Mater. Stephen J. Robbins '80, spoke on behalf of the Board of Trustees.

Ulysses Shields, MBA '02 and Vice President of Academic Relations, Alumni Association Board of Directors, provided remarks on behalf of the Alumni Association. Shields advised the graduates "Be ethical at all times and don't suffer your integrity for anyone, because once you lose it, it's hard to get back". His speech was particularly poignant as his son, Tristan, graduated Magna Cum Laude with the Class of 2009 with his bachelor's degree.

Will Steger is an environmental advocate and recognized authority for the Polar Regions. He has spent more than forty-five years traveling through the Arctic and has advised world leaders on the protection of Antarctica. Steger spoke to the graduates about living and graduating in a time of hardship saying, "Recession always brings good things because recession, crisis, forces us to take risks that we normally would not take."

Dr. Hagerty gave closing remarks, and bid a fond farewell to Franklin Pierce University, having served as president of Franklin Pierce since 1995. He said to the graduates, "...take time to relish this moment, to consider and celebrate that which you have accomplished, to dream great dreams, and return often to your academic home".

In all, 573 students crossed the stage during the ceremony. 44 received their doctoral degrees, 69 received their master's degrees, 427 received their bachelor's degrees, and 33 receiving their associate degree. Regardless of their degree earned, each graduate left the ceremony with a valuable education, a lifetime of memories, and a tan line where their mortarboard sat.

During the doctoral hooding ceremony on May 15th, 2009, Dr. Kim Mooney, spoke of "pinnacle moments" stating, "When you reach a pinnacle moment like this in your life...the sacrifices you made a long the way tend to recede from memory (as they should). But because there are so many lessons to be learned from those seemingly small but difficult choices, I congratulate you not only on this pinnacle moment, but also on your perseverance through the challenges and the setbacks that are dogged companions on any truly lofty journey or undertaking...."

She could easily have been speaking directly to (and of) Mary Ann Sullivan, an author, former Dominican nun and now Doctors of Arts in Leadership. Mary Ann Sullivan was among the three candidates for a Doctorate of Arts, but earning this degree was far from the first of her accomplishments.

Inspired by her father's stories growing up in County Cork, Ireland during the uprising and conflict, as well as a New York Times article about the suffering of children in the war, Dr. Sullivan published her novel, *Child of War*, in 1984. The book, which follows the life of a girl in Belfast, Northern Ireland during the conflict, was reviewed favorably by the New York Times and was distinguished as being a "notable book on social studies". She hoped the novel would "spur society to take actions toward peace".

Following her success as an author, Sullivan began researching and studying the 14th century Dominican nun, Blessed Margaret of Castello, translating her 14th century biography. Collaborating with an archivist, who was a Dutch Dominican monk, and observing his scholarly lifestyle inspired Sullivan to become a Dominican nun. Devoted to prayer, scholarly research, and teaching, Sullivan spent time in Fatima, Portugal praying for others seven hours a day. She was granted access to monastery computers, and while there created the digital production of a book about the life of Blessed Margaret of Costello. "While I was a nun, I was also a computer geek", Sullivan admits.

Since leaving convent life, Dr. Sullivan has become an up and coming leader in digital poetry, which uses language as well as a "sub-language" of grammatical code to increase its sensory reach to the visual and auditory as well as the literary. The poems are animated and often narrated, as well as read. Dr. Sullivan is able to work in the code, which must be arranged very specifically in order to work properly, as well as use software to craft her digital poetry. "Whatever the mission calls for, I'm equipped," she says.

Touching on what her alma mater has equipped her with, she says "At Franklin Pierce University I discovered a leadership that is organic, and grows right from the core of a person". She explains that to be effective, leadership can not be formulaic. "Although we can study various leaders, their decisions and actions, we would do well to avoid thinking their ideas and responses are the only way to go... A good decision and action made today, might not work tomorrow". Sullivan says that through her studies at Franklin Pierce University, she has been able to foster that type of organic leadership in herself.

She would like to see the university, she has gained so much knowledge from, develop a program in electronic literature, and expose the genre to additional eager minds. Now that she has received her doctorate, Dr. Sullivan plans to continue publishing, both in poetics and digital poetry. She started *The Tower Journal*, an on-line literary journal which features written works as well as digital poetry, during an Independent Study for the Doctor of Arts Program. An excerpt of her dissertation *Digital Poetry and the Greek Notion of Nous* can be seen in the November 2008 edition of *The Tower Journal*.

Reminding us that Franklin Pierce University is more than just its undergraduate program, Dr. Sullivan says "people who have accomplished a lot are interested in Franklin Pierce University". Armed with an abundance of achievements from her own life, Dr. Mary Ann Sullivan is a shining example of just that kind of person.

*The last week has been an exciting whirlwind of great times, sad good byes, and future opportunities. In this time I have come to reflect upon my experience at Franklin Pierce and want to express my deepest appreciation for being selected as the recipient of the 2007, 2008, and 2009 Franklin Pierce University Alumni Association Scholarship Award. It has been a privileged honor to be recognized for my academic achievements, by those who came before me as students of Franklin Pierce University and those who care about the well being of future Franklin Pierce students in need of financial assistance.

Your support has compelled me to take advantage of every situation presented to me. I proudly held my position as Class of 2009 Senator in the Student Government Association throughout my entire FPU tenure. I recently graduated fifth in my class with a 3.93 G.P.A. in the Honors Program, was named to the Dean's Honors List every semester, and provided a considerable commitment over my junior and senior years as a Civic Scholar for the New England Center for Civic Life.

I will be attending graduate school at the University of Connecticut in the fall. At UCONN I am enrolled in the M.A. in Sport Management & Sociology program. For my immediate plans, I signed a professional player contract with the Central Coast Rhinos of the Australian Ice Hockey League in Sydney, Australia for the remainder of their season till mid-August. I have only been down under for a couple of days now, but everything is going better than I expected and it is beautiful down here. My future ambitions are to not only earn my masters at UCONN, but also continue with the program to earn my Ph.D. in Sport Management and Sociology.

Franklin Pierce, my professors, coaches, and the Alumni Association helped me find guidance and opened doors for the future that I did not envision when I began my college career. Who would have thought that in the toughest economic year of my life, less than a week after graduation I would be sitting in Sydney, Australia living a childhood dream of playing professional hockey. I will never forget what Franklin Pierce has done for me, nor the people who made my accomplishments possible. I am unsure what the future holds, but I am secure with the thought that I will continue to make those who care about me and my alma mater proud.
